“Serving tables is not beneath spiritual leadership—it is spiritual leadership.”

LESSON 1

When Ministry Growth Creates Ministry Strain

Text: Acts 6:1

Key Truth

Growth without structure leads to division; God responds by raising servant-leaders.

Teaching Outline

- 1. “In those days... the disciples were multiplying”**
 - Growth is a blessing—but it exposes weaknesses
- 2. A complaint arose**
 - Not doctrinal error, but *distributional neglect*
- 3. Cultural and linguistic tension**
 - Hellenists vs. Hebrews
 - Ministry problems often emerge at the margins



Teaching Expansion

- Growth exposed *organizational vulnerability*
- Neglect was **unintentional but real**
- Unity was threatened—not doctrine

Leadership Truth

Problems do not mean failure—*they signal the need for structure.*

Deacon Application

- Deacons exist to **close ministry gaps**
- Silence in neglect leads to division

Leadership Insight for Deacons

- Deacons are often called into **messy spaces**, not visible platforms
- Neglect—even unintentional—can fracture fellowship

- What modern equivalents exist to the “daily distribution”?

Practical Application

Deacons must be *observant, approachable,* and *responsive* before complaints become divisions.
